

Minutes of meeting held by Bishop Burton Parish Council at Tall Trees entrance on Tuesday 10th October 2017 at 10am in Bishop Burton Village Hall.

Present:

Councillors: Cllr Jack Wray; Cllr Mark Hoddinott; Cllr Andrew Oxtoby.

Members of the public – Charlotte Quest.

Members of East Riding of Yorkshire Council: Paul Bellotti, Interim Director of Environment and Neighbourhood Services, and his colleague Paul.

The Clerk was also present.

The meeting was arranged in response to minute 9.1277 of the 25th September 2017 Bishop Burton Parish Council minutes.

10.1289 Re: Re-locating of speed cameras/signs on A1079

Further to much discussion and viewing the situation the following actions were agreed:

- Bins
 - Resident to ensure they are always left tight up to the fence on the road side of the hedge.
 - ERYC to instruct bin men to ensure that on emptying the bins are returned to their position tight to the fence.
- Hedge/verge
 - landowner to confirm to clerk that he gives permission to ERYC to trim back any hedges to improve visibility at the location of Tall Trees entrance, York Road, Bishop Burton.
 - On receipt of landowners confirmation above Mr Bellotti to request that the hedges and verges on either side of the Tall Trees entrance are cut back as soon as possible to improve visibility.
 - On receipt of landowners confirmation above Mr Bellotti to ensure ERYC include in their schedule regularly cutting back the hedge and verges on either side of the Tall Trees entrance to ensure maximum visibility is maintained.
 - The landowner and Tall Trees resident to advise the Clerk if in future the hedges/verges become in need of cutting. Clerk to advise Mr Bellotti, so action can be taken.
- Speed Camera/lights/grey box
 - It was agreed that when other relevant works are undertaken in Humberside the re-positioning of the cameras/lights/grey box would be included. This could be work in conjunction with Hull or work on the North or South bank of the Humber in Humberside. No timing could be confirmed but it was hoped that it would not be in the too distant future. Mr Bellotti to advise.
 - It was agreed that before the works were undertaken ERYC would share the proposed new position of the cameras/lights/grey box with Bishop Burton Parish Council and the Tall Trees resident for their comments. Mr Bellotti to advise.
 - It was acknowledged that it was regrettable that the Parish Council had not been consulted prior to the current cameras being installed. It was acknowledged that the position of the current camera/lights/grey box is not ideal and does reduce visibility. Mr Bellotti offered apologies on behalf of ERYC for the lack of consultation re the positioning of the cameras/lights/grey box, such apologies being gratefully accepted.
 - It is acknowledged that Mr Bellotti stated that he was not able to put an exact timescale on the work re re-positioning of the speed camera/lights/grey box as it is dependent on being part of another contract. However, the Parish Council stated that it hoped that the matter would be resolved in the next 12 months. Mr Bellotti confirmed that he could not guarantee this.
 - The Parish Council confirmed that it looks forward to receiving the plans.

Mr Bellotti and his colleague were thanked for their time and help in moving the matter forward.
