Ingredients Cake

6oz (175g) soft margarine 6oz (175g) caster sugar 3 eggs 6oz (175g) self-raising flour 1.5 tsps baking powder

Filling and topping

Raspberry jam Icing sugar

Equipment

2x7 inch (18cm) tins

<u>Given Recipe – Victoria Sandwich</u> Method

- 1. Grease and base line the tins.
- 2. Pre-heat oven to 180°C, 350°F or gas 4.
- 3. Measure all ingredients into a large bowl and beat well until thoroughly blended. Divide evenly between the tins and level off.
- 4. Bake in the pre-heated oven for about 25 minutes until the top of the cakes spring back when lightly pressed with a finger.
- 5. Leave to cool in tin for a few minutes. Then turn out, peel off the paper and finish off cooling on a wire rack.
- 6. When completely cold sandwich together with the jam and sprinkle the top with icing sugar.
